Adult Education is an independent learning program which offers a variety of high school credits. To sign up you need to provide the school with a few things.

- 1. **\$50.00**: this is a book deposit. **Cash payment only** will be accepted (please have the exact amount when registering). If a program or service is going to pay for your schooling (eg. Ontario Works) you must prearrange payment with them as no cheques will be accepted.
 - The book deposit is fully refundable once the courses are done and the books have been returned.
- 2. You must provide identification that includes your date of birth. Status card, birth certificate, health card or driver's license are all acceptable.
- 3. You will be required to fill in a registration form which must include your current address with the postal code and your phone number.

Registration is on a first come, first serve basis. Once you have registered, I will assist you in choosing the courses needed to earn a high school diploma.

If you do not know how many credits you have or if you qualifY for mature credits, you should make an appointment with Ms. Kathy Blanchard (Program Leader - Guidance) at Espanola High School to discuss your options. She may be reached at 869-1590 ex. 6214.

COURSES

Courses are subject to availability so you may not receive your first choice, or you may have to wait until new books are ordered.

When you start your course you will receive Unit 1. When the lessons in that unit are completed and handed in you will receive the next unit.

Each course has 4 units with 5 lessons per unit. Only the key questions in each lesson will be marked. The support questions are available for practice but should not be submitted.

All compulsory courses will have a final exam written in the evening worth 30% of your final mark. YOU NEED 60% TO PASS EACH COURSE.

COMMUNITY HOURS & ONTARIO LITERACY TEST

If you entered high school during or after the 1999/2000 school year, you will be required to complete the 40 hours of mandatory Community Service and the Ontario Secondary School Literacy test. The Literacy test is written on one date in April for all students in Ontario and you will need to make arrangements with the Adult Ed. Coordinator to write the test.
